



PAX Moot Court is an international mooting competition focused on **Transnational Private International Law**.

In this competition, students learn to navigate EU Regulations and international treaties that apply across multiple jurisdictions and require uniform interpretation.

The Moot Court comprises **two phases, a written phase and an oral phase**.

The teams are presented with a case focused on Private International Law issues (such as jurisdiction, choice of law or recognition and enforcement), and students gain first-hand experience in understanding and applying the complexities and nuances of how international conventions and EU Regulations interact in the context of transnational litigation.

Private International Law is the set of legal principles and rules that determines the applicable law in international civil and commercial cases, allocates jurisdiction, and regulates the recognition and enforcement of foreign judgments.

This field of law often lies at the heart of significant multinational legal disputes, where in certain instances the entire case hinges on which court has jurisdiction, which law applies or the cross-border effects of judgments.

In the oral phase, teams plead before renowned judges, academics, and practicing lawyers in Private International Law.
